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# **Executive Summary**

### **Background**

Australia has twice hosted the World DipCon

- 1992 WDC III 76 players (including 7 International players)
  - ➤1992 World Champion Steve Gould (AUS)
- 2002 WDC XII 56 players (including15 International players)
  - ≥2002 World Champion Rob Stephenson (AUS)

Proposed 2011 – WDC XXI – 80 players

#### **Estimated Income**

TD Expenses	\$500
Tournament consumables	\$500
Trophies / Prizes	\$1,000
Marketing (web, printing etc)	\$1,000
Venue Hire (4 days)	\$8,000

# **Venue Selection**

#### **Venue Criteria**

- Quality: Venue will showcase Sydney to international players
- Gaming Area: Must accommodate all players in a single room.
- Licensed Bar Area: Within easy access.
- Food Outlets: Within easy access to minimise lunch time delays.
- Accommodation: Preferably available onsite and / or very close by.
- Transport: Near Sydney airport and easy public transport access.
